# YOUTH SOLANO LIVING

## All departments in Solano Youth Living are open to youth residing in Solano and surrounding counties.

The Junior Department is for youth who wish to enter in one of the categories described below to compete against other youth at the Solano County Fair. Some exhibitors are members of organizations, such as 4-H and FFA, and there may be some classes and divisions limited to members of such organizations. The Solano County Fair provides the opportunity for young people who are not members of such organizations to exhibit in Youth Solano Living. In some cases, depending on the number of entries, these "independent juniors" compete in the appropriate class in direct competition with an organization member. In other cases there may be separate classes for independent juniors.

## 4-H DEPARTMENT

4-H Youth programs are non-formal voluntary educational programs, under the supervision of the University of California Cooperative Extension and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The projects exhibited at fairs by members of these groups are the results of their efforts under the supervision of volunteer adults.

## FFA DEPARTMENT

FFA is a national organization of students enrolled in high school vocational agriculture classes. The local unit is the chapter in each school offering vocational agriculture, under the supervision of the agricultural teacher who is also the local chapter advisor. The state unit includes all chapters in the state, under the supervision of the State Department of Education as represented by the Bureau of Agricultural Education, with its headquarters at the State Education Building in Sacramento, Calif. The national unit is the group of associates in each state and Puerto Rico, under the supervision of the Agricultural Education Division of the U.S. Office of Health, Education and Welfare in Washington, D.C.

Every Future Farmer project in livestock, poultry, fruit or crops is part of the practical education of the vocational agriculture student who owns it. The program includes the improvement of agriculture leading ultimately to the

ownership of the farms and the development of good rural citizenship. Participation in fairs is recognized as having educational value as well as simulation for better results and finer projects.

Industrial Education: Industrial education is an integral part of the total program of education. The branches of learning represented by industrial education are industrial arts and vocational and trade education.

- Industrial Arts Education provides for personal identification with work of industry, for satisfactions that are found in creative craftsmanship, and for developing values that are important to the consumers of goods and services.
- Vocational and Trade Education develops occupational competencies that prepare people to enter employment in specific industries and service occupations.

## ELIGIBILITY & AGE REQUIREMENTS

### 4-H Club Members

**Primary members:** A 4-H member may enroll when eligible for entrance in Kindergarten through third grade. These members are designated as primary members and are not eligible to show livestock at the Solano County Fair. Primary members are eligible to participate in non-livestock categories in the Youth Solano Living Department.

**Junior, Intermediate & Senior:** Must be 9 years old or in 4th grade by December 31, 2016. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19. Exhibitor must be in good and regular standing his/her local 4-H Club. All 4-H members must be enrolled in the 4-H project in which they enter. Members, who are not enrolled in a particular 4-H project, may enter the junior section.

### FFA Members

Members may participate in classes when they enroll in high school vocational agricultural classes and, may exhibit as a member to the end of the calendar year following graduation.

### Youth Exhibitors

Open to youth ages 5 to 17 on January 1, 2017. Youth who are 9 years old or in the

4th grade by January 1, 2017 are eligible to exhibit animal projects. This Department is also open to exhibitors who are members of the above organizations when entering projects that are not organizational projects. When entering please **write your school name or none** on the club line of your entry form.

## DEPARTMENT RULES & INFORMATION

1. All Local and State rules are applicable.
2. Youth Solano Living will use the Danish system of judging unless otherwise specified.
3. All products being considered for cash prizes, which have not otherwise been eliminated from consideration, will be opened and judged.
4. Perishable exhibits not picked up within release time or are in advanced state of deterioration will be discarded.
5. There is no limit on the number of entries per class, unless otherwise stated.
6. Entries must be made exclusively by exhibitor and may be entered only once.
7. Must have been prepared, grown, made, improved or raised by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
8. **Please list all 4-H, FFA and Junior Division entries on separate entry forms.**
9. All special award sponsors are identified at the end of Youth Solano Living.
10. No accessories of foreign foliage permitted.
11. Exhibits must be disease and insect free.
12. Schools and educational institutions may make arrangements to submit entries prior to the end of the school year. Please contact the Fair Admin Office at (707) 551-2000.

### SPECIAL RULES AND INFORMATION

- Exhibits in the Agriculture Department must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled.
- Quality desired in agricultural products is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market. Exhibits stressing features which detract from the commercial value of any product are undesirable and should be avoided.

#### 4. Number of specimens for plate display:

**1 Specimen Each:** Large vegetables / fruits such as melons, filled pumpkins, large winter squash.

**1-Quart Bag Each:** Cereals (barley, wheat), dry beans, field corn, alfalfa, oats, safflowers, etc.

**3 Specimens Each:** Sugar beets, small fruited squash, round tomatoes, kiwi, peaches, pears, cucumbers, etc.

**3 Specimens Each:** Onions, garlic, small size pickling cucumbers, apricots and plums.

**6 Specimens Each:** Berries, cherries, grapes, peas, prunes, nut crops, snap beans, and lima beans.

- Exhibits must be, at least, equal in maturity as the stage of ripeness in order to be considered for cash awards.

- “**Mature**” means having reached that stage of ripeness which will ensure the completion of the ripening

process to a degree which will insure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant, or vine.

- “**Override**” means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption.

- Management retains right to remove any exhibit that becomes unsightly.
- No treated seed or grain will be displayed.

- Each entry must be listed on the entry form separately by name, type of item (i.e. blackberry jam, beef jerky, etc.), date preserved and method used.

### Products

SIGN UP ONLINE AT SCFAIR.COM

- Non-acid foods must be canned under pressure. Low-acid foods should be made more acidic by adding lemon or vinegar with amount listed on the label.
- Items not prepared by recommended methods will not be accepted.
- All canned products, except jams and jellies, must be water-bath processed or pressure canned.
- All jars must have rings. **Please do not decorate rings or lids with fabric, etc.**

### Exhibit

- Canned exhibits are 2 jars of each item entered. Tasting jar may be smaller. One jar will be opened and judged; sealed jar will be placed on display.
- Dried exhibits consist of: jerky (6 to 8 strips), fruit (6 to 8 pieces), herbs (1 container), and juice (2 bottles).
- Standard Container is a container specifically designed for this purpose with a 1- or 2-piece dome lid. Dried products should be wrapped in clear plastic or placed in bags, jars or other appropriate clear storage containers.
- No paraffin seals accepted.

### Labels

- Product name, date of preservation, method of preservation and list of all ingredients. In pickling, state ratio of water to vinegar. Apply a second label to the bottom or back of jars / containers or back of jars / containers with name, item name, date preserved and preservation method.
